*Orphismic* is a new series of works combining multi-layered, sprayed acrylic with thick layers of impasto oil paint. The title of the show refers to a style coined by Guillaume Apollinaire to describe works that immerse the viewer in pure aesthetic pleasure while retaining a sense of structure and sublime meaning; however, this is where the relationship ends.

While Orphism defines images created entirely from the artist's consciousness, the forms in Vergette's paintings are culled from vintage T-shirt graphics. The graphics have been partially recreated, but the original meaning has been lost and the viewer is left with the minimalistic form as a way marker.
